As we continue this journey together, let us nurture learners who are curious in thought, responsible in action, and compassionate at heart.

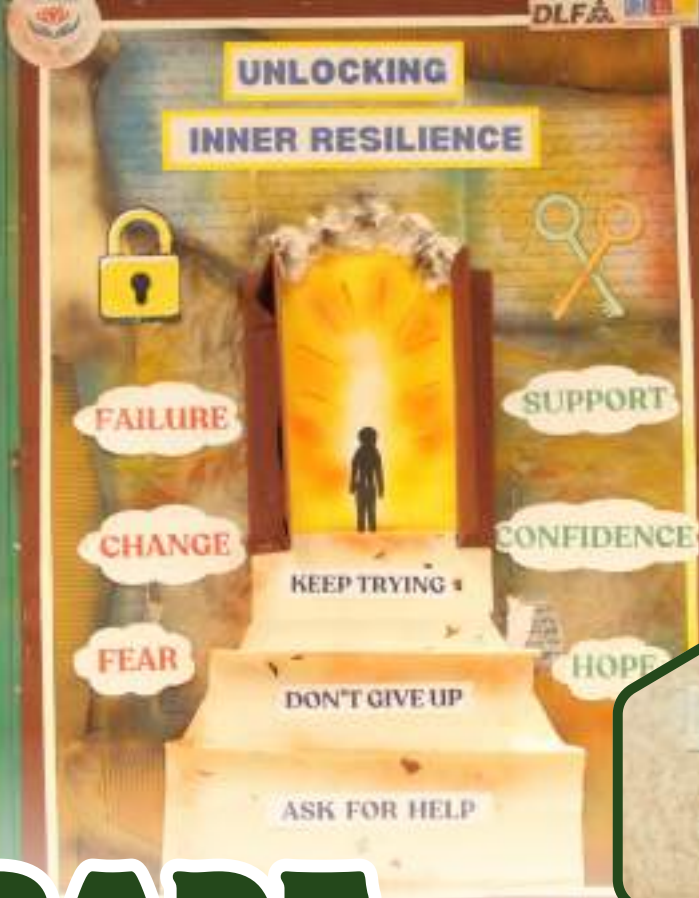

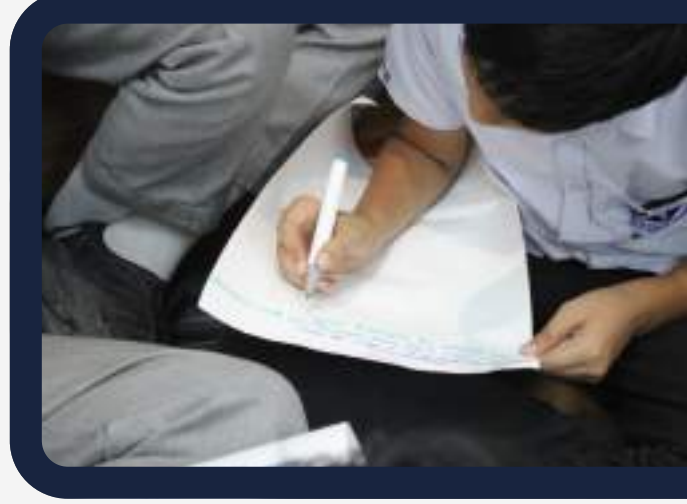




# PUPPETRY WORKSHOP

A puppetry workshop for Pre-Nursery to Grade V introduced students to storytelling through puppets, fostering creativity and imagination.





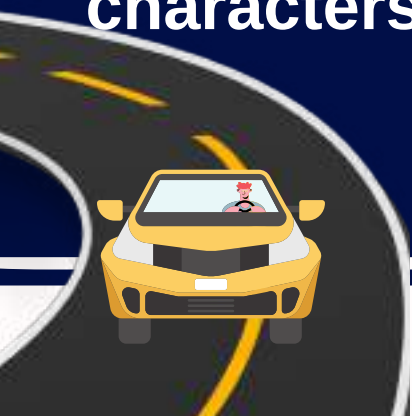
# CALLIGRAPHY WORKSHOP

## Mini Lecture

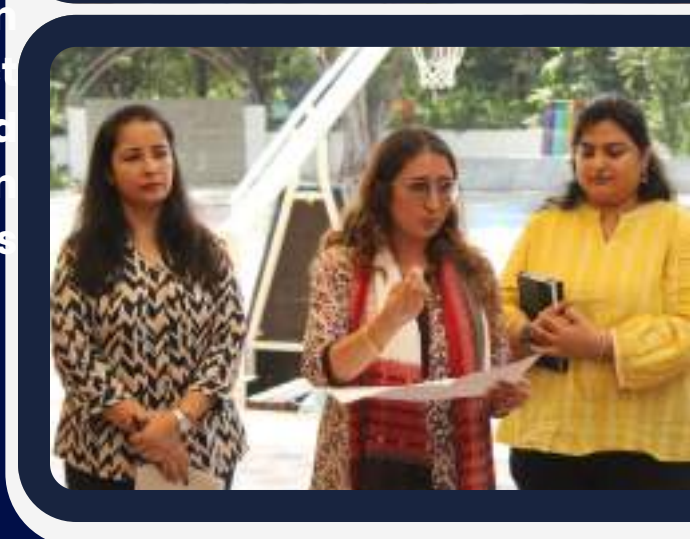
Teachers participated in a training session on mini-lectures and visible thinking routines, gaining practical strategies to enhance classroom engagement and deeper learning.

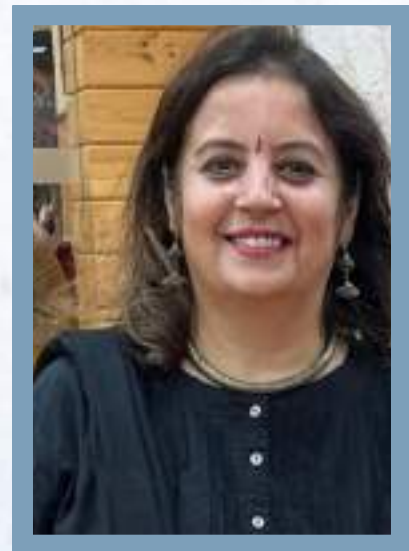

# Bagless Day: Exploring STEM the Fun Way

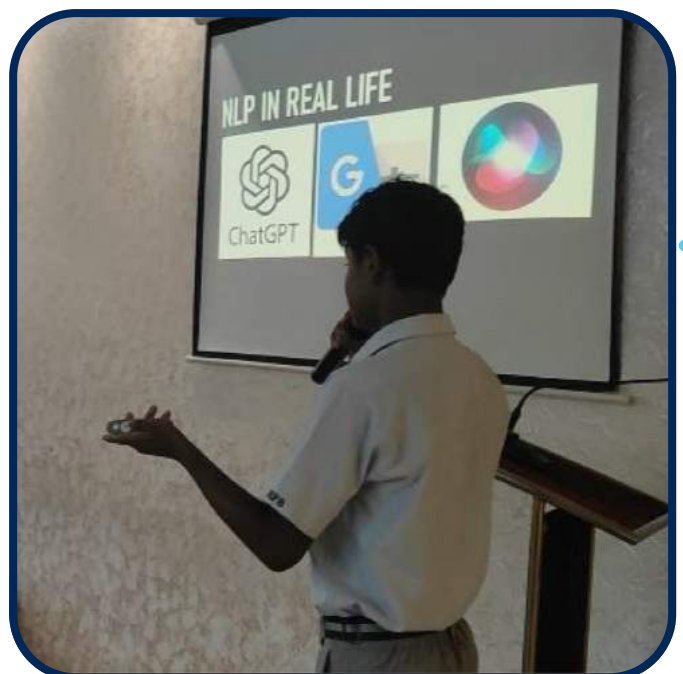

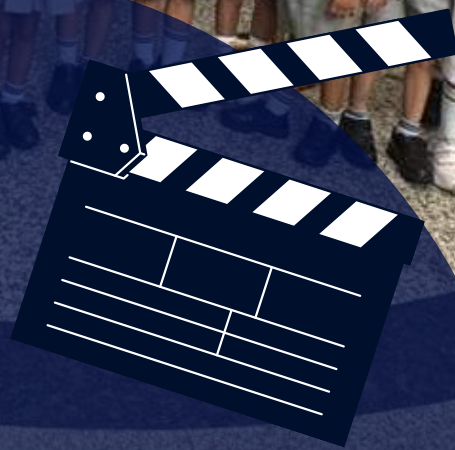

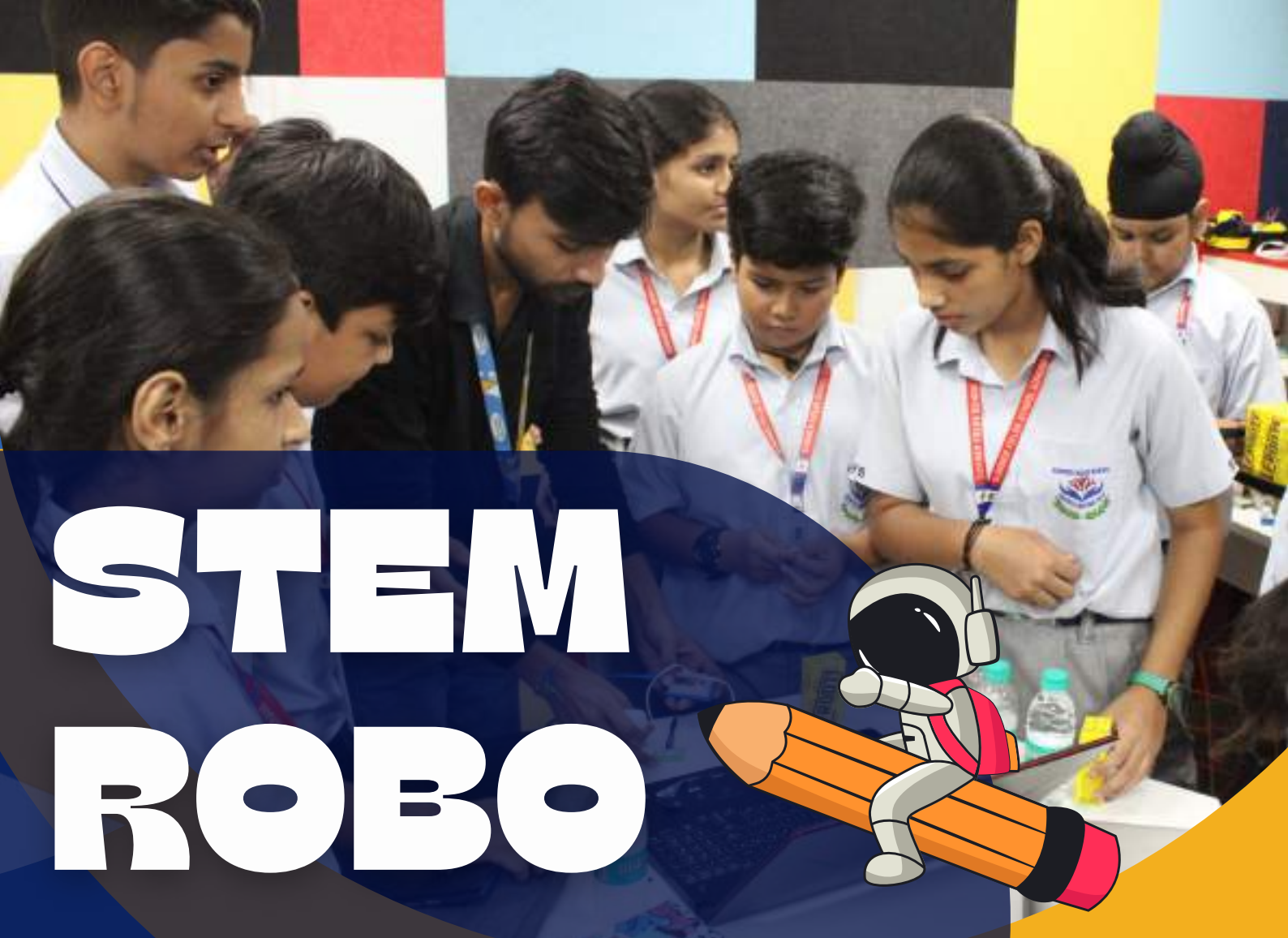


# Movie outing
